Helen Cleo (Fox) Bass' parents were Hoolie Melvin Fox and Cleo Bell West.

1900, Dec 7 – Hoolie Melvin Fox born in Colleton County, South Carolina. (d: 1949, Jan 10) Buried at Live Oak Cemetery, Walterboro, Colleton County, South Carolina

1909, Mar 21 – Cleo Bell West born in Waycross, Georgia. (d: 2007, Dec 2)

1924, Jul 1 – Hoolie Fox Marriage to **Cleo B. West** (aka Granny)

Helen and Cleo's lineage at follows: (Note, the names earlier than Robert Charles West (1848 – 1910) are not independently confirmed. **(Listed in reverse chronological order)**)

Christopher W. “Critt” West (1872, Dec 26 – 1935, Nov 27) (Cleo B. West’s father)

Born in Gains Mill, Coffee County, Georgia.

Profession in 1900 (Census) listed as “Carpenter”. He and his wife, **Laura (Smith) West (Cleo’s mother)** were living with her parents (**Hermon** and **Florence** Smith) at the time in Waycross, Ware County, Georgia.

Profession in 1910 (Census) was House Carpenter. Still living with **Hermon** and **Florence** Smith as a “Lodger”. Married to their daughter.

Profession in 1920 (Census) was “Mechanic”.

Profession in 1921 listed as “Car Repair” in the city Directory.

The 1935 Census shows C.W. West living in Palm Beach, Florida (shortly before his death)

Buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery, West Palm Beach, Florida. Block 8 lot 158

Mrs. West was born in Savannah, Ga., and came to this city 17 years ago from Waycross, Ga.

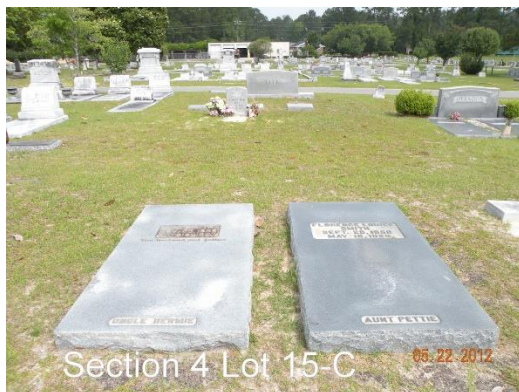

Both are buried in Oakland Cemetery in Waycross, Georgia, Section 4, Lot 15-C. In 1900 and 1910 (Census), **Herman**'s profession is listed as a Railroad Hostler (switching locomotive engineer).

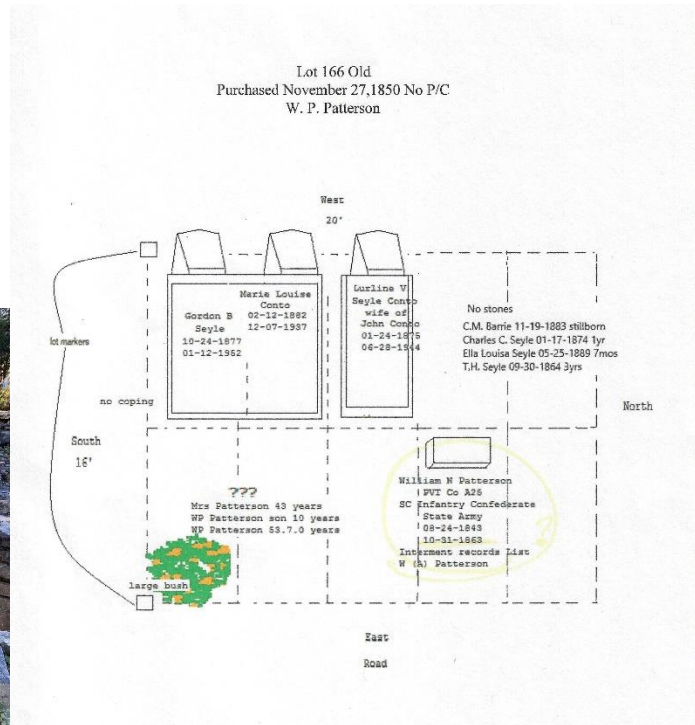


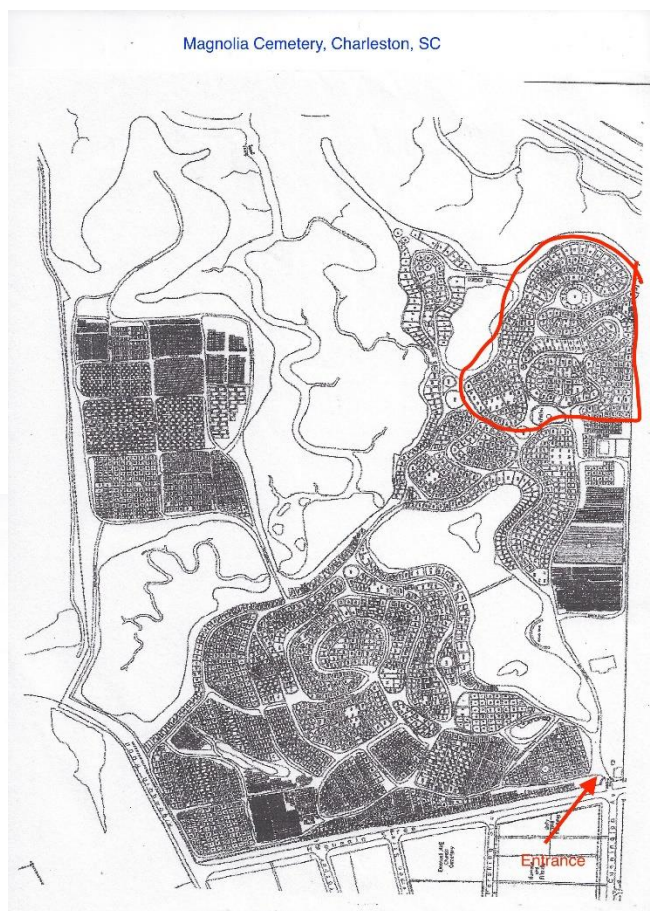
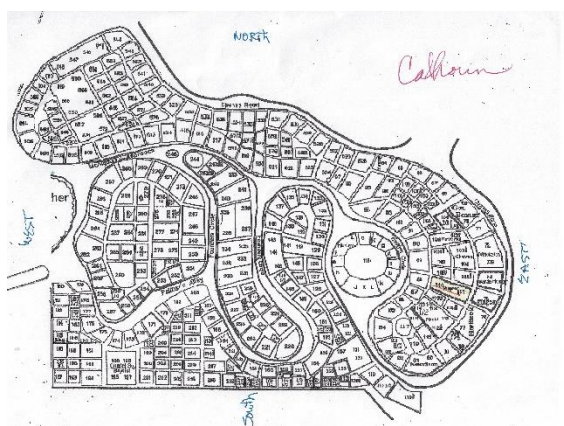
The parents of **Florence Louise (Patterson) Smith** (1858-1929) were **William Perry Patterson** (1816, Oct 8 – 1871, Apr 1) and **Lydia Catherine Clark** (1821-1864). **William Perry Patterson**

was born in Baltimore, Maryland and died in Charleston, South Carolina. His father was **William Patterson Sr.** (1752, Nov 1 – 1835, Jul 7). **William Sr.** was born in Ulster, Ireland and died in Baltimore, Maryland.

William Perry Patterson's wife, Lydia Catherine Clark was born and died in Charleston, South Carolina.

William Perry Patterson (1816-1871) is buried in Magnolia Cemetery in Charleston, South Carolina, Lot 166 Old.





His wife, Lydia Catherine Clark Patterson is buried next to him but has no marker.

Laura's Grandparents were **Henry William Smith** (1807 – 1877, Apr 24) and **Adeline Taylor Smith** (1815 – 1896, Oct 10). Both are buried in Laurel Grove Cemetery in Savannah, Georgia.



The parents of (Sarah) **Adeline Taylor Smith** were **Capt Joseph Taylor** (1766, Oct 6 – 1820, Jan 1) and **Grizzell Hamilton Taylor** (1782, Aug 6 – 1847, Mar 27). Both are buried in the Saint Phillip's Episcopal Church Cemetery in Charleston, South Carolina, Plot 35 Section L and Plot 34 Section A. **Capt Joseph Taylor** was born in Delaware and died in Charleston, South Carolina. **Capt Taylor** was a Sailing Master in the United States Navy during the War of 1812.

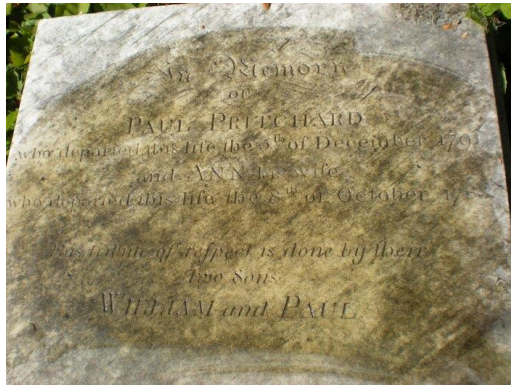


Grizzell's parents were **Lieutenant David Hamilton** (1749, May 14 – 1794, Nov 29) of Cork, Ireland. He died in Charleston, South Carolina and is buried in Saint Phillip's Episcopal Church Cemetery in Charleston, Plot 42, Section L. E-0042. His mother was **Elizabeth Reynolds George** (1775 – 1839, Apr 1). She was born and died in Charleston, South Carolina and is buried Trinity Methodist Church Cemetery.



David was a Lieutenant in the militia during the Revolution, and was one of those who surrendered to the British in May of 1780 after the fall of Charleston. He married Elizabeth Reynolds daughter of the Rev. James Reynolds and Mary Ball of James Island. Also the father of Ann David Hamilton who secondly married Samuel Harvey who was buried at Trinity Episcopal

Elizabeth's' parents were Rev James Reynolds () and Ann Ball Pritchard (unk – 1788). Ann is buried in the Pritchard Family Cemetery in Mount Pleasant, Charleston County, South Carolina. Pritchard was here name from her 3rd and final marriage to Paul Pritchard.



Charles Robert West (1848, Feb 21 – 1910, Aug 5)

Born in Paddington, London, England as were both of his parents, and died in Ware County, Georgia. Buried in Kettle Creek Cemetery, Waycross, Georgia.

Served as a Private the 63rd Georgia Infantry, Company K.

Enlisted at age 15 on Dec 1, 1863. Hospitalized in Macon, Georgia with dysentery.

Mustered out on Sep 15, 1864.

1872, Mar – Charles Robert West (age 24) married Emma Kate Wright.

1880 Census lists Charles West profession as “farming” in Coffee County, Georgia. Wife Emma Kate (Wright) West was “housekeeping”.

Profession in the 1900 Census, is “farmer”.

In 1900, the family was living in Waltertown, Ware County, Georgia.

In 1910, (Robert) Charles West was 62 and living with his wife, Emma Kate West, and younger children, renting a house at 126 Ice Ave, in Waycross, Georgia. He died this year.

In 1930, Emma Kate was living with her daughters family in McPherson Ave, DeKalb, Georgia.

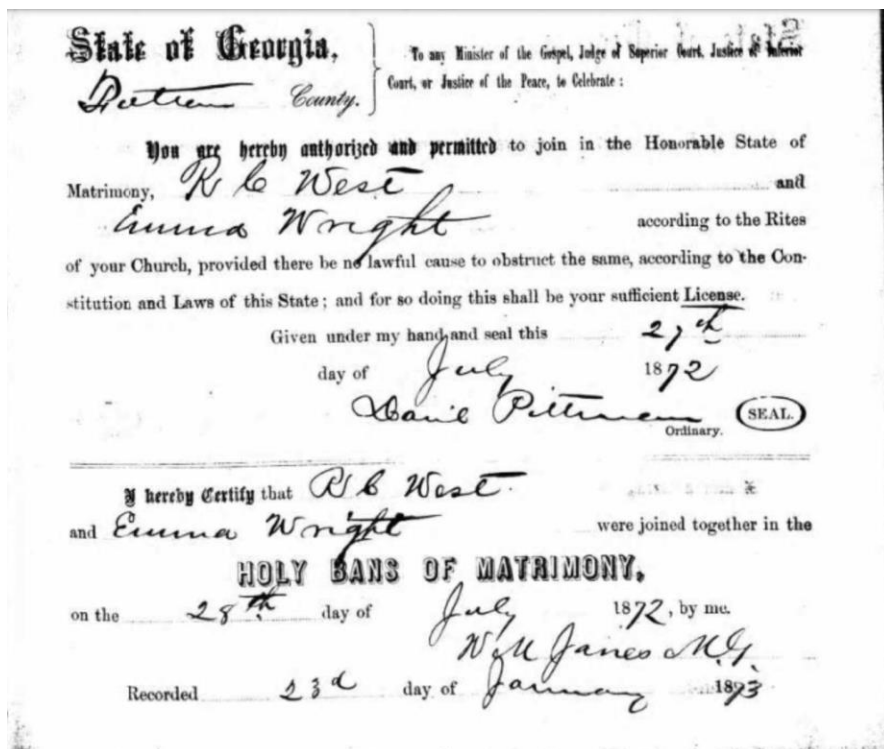

Charles West was married to **Emma Kate Wright West** (1859, Feb 8 – 1953, Apr 25) on July 28, 1872 in Fulton County, Georgia. She was likely born in South Carolina, as were both of her parents, and is also buried in Kettle Creek Cemetery in Waycross, Georgia.



The below are believed to be the father and grandfather of Robert Charles West (1848-1910) but have not been independently confirmed by me. *I am suspect of Henry West and earlier as I did not find his son, Charles Robert West (born in 1848) in an 1850 London Census.*

Henry West (1814, Aug 24 – 1889, Jan)

Born and died in Wilton, Wilshire, England.

Henry married **Maria Pomroy** (1822 – 1880) who was born in Christchurch, Hampshire, England.

Lazarus West (1779 – 1876, Nov 16)

Born in Salisbury, St. Edmund, Wiltshire, England. Profession was “Laborer” He is possibly the son of a William West (1753 – 1832) of Wilshire, England.
